Any nonprofit group that falls under the guidelines of the Foundation's grant policy can apply for a grant from the Custer County Foundation. Grants have been awarded in the areas of arts, community service, law enforcement and drug awareness, recreation, and youth activities. To review the criteria or download the application, please visit the Foundation's website at custercountyfoundation.org, select grants and then grant guidelines from the drop-down menu. Please note that the grant criteria has recently been updated. The current grant deadline is fast approaching, so we urge you to submit your completed grant application soon. The Custer County Foundation has proudly reinvested over \$4 million back into Custer County in the form of grants, scholarships, and program support. This would not be possible without the leadership provided by the 15-member Board of Directors, past and present. These dedicated volunteers come from all across Custer County. They have one thing in common: they are committed to our county's vitality and progress. The board members are responsible for the administration of the Foundation's pool of funds and the careful investment of monetary donations for the present and future needs of the residents of Custer County.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for raising money at the

annual Gala, which is held the second Saturday of December. Donations received at the Gala fund the grants and nontraditional scholarship program. Each board member is asked to serve on two of the following committees: Executive, Finance/Investment, Scholarships/Grants, Marketing/Development, Building/Safety, Nominating, and Gala. The committees meet quarterly and present recommendations to the entire board for approval or denial, as they work to keep the purpose of the Foundation in highest regard.

When selecting new board members, the Board of Directors takes into account many aspects. They consider gender, age, occupation, and many other factors as they work to find the best fit for the position they are filling. A board that represents the diversity of the entire county is important. Each board member can serve three terms of three years each, for a total of nine years if they so choose.

Some great things you will experience while serving on the board:

- st Giving away \$84,500 in scholarships to prospective and current college students every spring.
- * Awarding \$75,000 in grants annually to charitable organizations that directly impact the residents of Custer County.
- * Helping plan an event where generous patrons not only enjoy a great evening of food and entertainment, but where funds are generated for our area scholarships and grants.
